

ANZAC DAY REFLECTION From a Kingsley Parent, Remy



There isn't a strong history of serving in the military in our family, so I'm not sure where my strong desire to serve came from. I never met my great grandfather who served in WW2 as he passed before I was born. But I knew in Yr 10 I wanted to join the Navy- much to my parents disapproval! I wanted to experience serving and protecting our country as a young person so I was enlisted in the R.A.N. (Royal Australian Navy) from 2001-2007 as a Combat Systems Operator, where I spent several years at sea on H.M.A.S.'s Adelaide and Canberra (both frigates are now decommissioned and dive wrecks). I was involved with Border Protection Operations which earned us a medal.

Life as a sailor is extremely challenging and unique, but the life skills, camaraderie, discipline and hard working ethos gained was second to none. I also got to see many parts of the world while we practiced war exercises with other countries.

For me, ANZAC Day fills me with a huge sense of pride being able to wear my medals and march to honour those who came before and after us. My boys are really eager and proud to carry on our ANZAC spirit, honour and participate in commemorations and not let those who fought and died protecting us be forgotten. Brodie hopes to go on and become a pilot in the military when he is old enough-something I will be extremely proud of for sure!

After carefully crafting and decorating their hats, they proudly wore them and transformed into a crew of adventurous pirates! They embarked on a treasure hunt around Kingsley Park, practising their Maths positional language to guide their way. 


