SunSmart reminder



Just a reminder that all students and staff are expected to wear a named, broad brimmed navy-blue hat during any outside activities from the beginning of September to (end of) May. Teachers on play support will be reminding students that No Hat makes for No Play. Students without an approved hat will be directed to remain in a shaded area. Kingsley Park Primary School encourages all staff and students to apply SPF50 sunscreen daily whenever UV levels reach 3 and above. Sunscreen should be applied at least 20 minutes before going outdoors and reapplied every two hours (or more frequently if sweating or swimming). Students and staff are encouraged to bring their own SPF50 sunscreen to school and apply during eating times ready for outside times.



Please remember if you are picking up your child early from school, communication to the teacher via Sentral is the most effective option. Interruptions to classrooms during learning time can be very distracting to both children and teachers. With early notice, teachers can ensure children are packed up and ready.

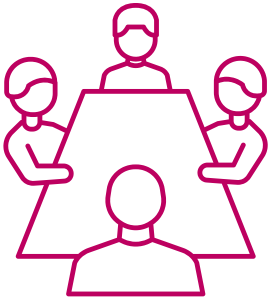

2026 School Council - Elections 2026

Parents are a very important part of our school community.
To run effectively, we need parent input on our school council.

Nominations opened on Monday 23rd February for our election process for the 2026 School Council. Over the next 12 months this new group will meet monthly to:

- track the broad direction and vision for the school
- develop, review and update the policies of the school
- approve fundraising events for school related purposes
- exercise general oversight of the buildings and grounds, ensuring they are kept in good order and condition
- ensure all money coming into the hands of the council is properly expended
- ensure they take into account the views expressed by the school community, for the purpose of making decisions in the best interests of the school and our students * ensure the annual report and school's strategic plan is published and available to the school community
- stimulate interest in the school in the wider community

If you are considering nominating for a position on council this year, we have 4 vacant positions so please consider jumping on board. Nominations forms are available at the school office now.

Nominations forms must be lodged to the school office by no later than 4pm on Monday 2nd March.

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school in the front office. The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:

Parent member: 5 vacant positions. (1 of these is one year casual vacancy)

School employee member: 1 vacant position.

Term of office is - From the day after the date of the declaration of the poll in March 2026 to and inclusive of the date of the declaration of poll in March 2028.

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, a notice to that effect and calling for further nominations will be posted in a prominent position at the school. If the number of nominations is more than the number of vacancies, a ballot will be held. If required, the ballot will close at 4pm on Tuesday 10th March.

Our next meeting will be held on Wednesday 18th March at 6.00pm.

LATE ARRIVAL & EARLY LEAVE

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE:

CAMPS, SPORTS, EXCURSIONS FUNDING (CSEF) FOR 2025

Parents with Health Care Cards/Pensions Cards can apply for CSEF. If you applied for CSEF at Kingsley Park Primary School in 2025, you do not need to reapply in 2026 unless:

- you have another child starting school i.e. Prep
- you have moved to our school during the year.
 - you applied at another school in 2025.
- you have recently been issued a Health Care/Pension Card

Any parents who hold a Health Care Card/Pension Card and did not apply/receive CSEF through our school last year, please obtain a form from the office for CSEF funding in 2026. The annual CSEF amount is \$150 per Primary School Student

A huge thank you to the parents who came along and cheered our swimmers on and supported our team.

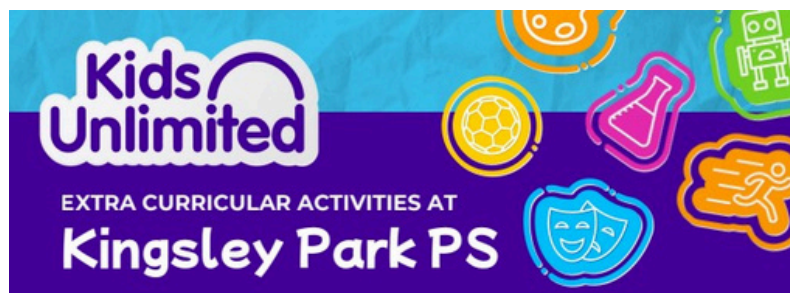

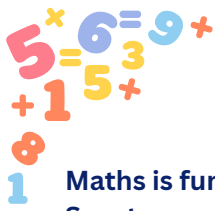

World Maths Day is coming on Wednesday 25th March.

WORLD MATHS DAY



1

Maths is fun so it should be celebrated every day. It is in our lives daily. Sports provide a good opportunity to engage your child in maths, particularly if they are a keen sportsperson. Here are some questions to ask your child when watching or playing their favourite sport:

- How does your favourite sport tally the score? What maths is presented on the tally?
- How do other sports tally the score – for example, tennis, golf, cricket, netball, football?
- What maths do you use to find the total of the scores?
- Who is at the top of the ladder? How is this determined? •Are there other ways to record the score?
- How long do your favourite sport games go for in minutes and seconds? How is the time in the game divided? Into halves, quarters or something else?
- What are the shapes of different playing fields and courts? Talk about edges and angles.
- How can you estimate the perimeter and area of a playing field?
- How many cars could be parked on the MCG field or at your local sports ground? How could we work this out?



During week 9, children will take part in some fun maths games and a whole school maths scavenger hunt. Please do some maths practice at home also. The importance of knowing the times tables can never be underestimated and helps in all aspects of life so keep practising.



The Importance of School Attendance:

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KISS & GO ZONE

We are a lucky community having a Kiss & Go Zone right at the front of the front of the school. It is important to understand that the parking directly outside of the school's main entry is a Kiss and Go Zone before and after school. This means:

- **Do not leave your vehicle**

To assist with traffic flow, drivers should remain in the car whilst children get in and out.

- **Be timely**

If your child does not get in or out of the vehicle within 2 minutes you must leave and re-enter the Kiss & Go zone.

- **Child safety**

Please ensure children get in or out of the vehicle on the kerb side. The back seat is the safest seat for children to travel in. Ensure children have their restraints securely fastened before driving off.

- **Stay in sequence**

Drop off or pick up your child close to the top of the zone, as far forward as possible. This allows vehicles following you to enter the zone in an orderly manner.

- **Driver duty of care**

Observe traffic when entering or leaving the zone. Use your indicator to advise when moving into or out of the zone.

- **No U-turns**

Do not do U-turn in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put children at risk.

Please ensure that you travel at the **40kmph Speed Limit** around our school at all times.



NO Double parking : DO NOT double park. DO NOT allow your child/ren to enter the car when you are double parked and not safely in a provided car park.

Be patient: We understand that at times we need to wait patiently for a car park. Patience could save a child's life rather than endanger it.

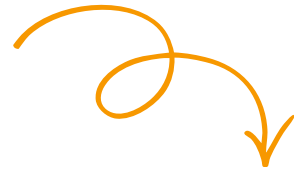
