

Time to Plan Ahead! I respect that it is scary to think about 2026, but we are beginning to look at our enrolment numbers, staffing and whole school structure.

During Term 3, Junior students have been investigating what has changed over time. To finish off our awesome adventure into History; we immersed ourselves into experiencing things of the past like: watching an old Disney cartoon, exploring clothes and hats from the 40's, 50's and 60's (thanks to Elyan and Elroy from J10) and, checking out Mr Gardner's 1954 Ford Mustang.

On Tuesday 16th of September, we took a journey into the past with a trip on Puffing Billy. It was such a

YEAR 1 STEM

This term in STEM, our Year I students learned all about light and sound. They found out how they were made and how we used our senses to notice them. They had fun tasting foods that were sour, sweet, bitter, and salty, and feeling different textures in mystery boxes. They also explored 8 different jars with different smells—some were yummy, and some made them wrinkle their noses! They discovered that the Sun is a natural source of light and that we can only see things when there's light shining on them. They also explored what happens to shadows when a torch was shone on an object, noticing how the shadows could change size and shape. The Year Ones enjoyed making cup telephones to see how vibrations create sound. During all these activities, the students practiced being little scientists by asking questions, making predictions, and writing down what they found out.









































PREP & YR 2 STEM

In Term 3 STEM, the Foundation and Year 2 students had lots of fun learning about flight! They made their own flying creations, including helicopters, kites, planes, hoop gliders, and even roomerangs. The students tested how far and how high their flyers could go, using their Maths skills to informally measure the results. They also discovered some cool Science ideas – like how the size and shape of an object can change the way it moves, and how pushes and pulls help things fly. They even learned about the four forces of flight – lift, thrust, drag, and weight – and how these work together to help objects fly.





































Crazy fun with Chemical Science!

During Term 3, students from Years 3-6 conducted theory and experiential lessons to learn about Chemical Science. They learned about 'matter' which are the tiny particles that make up everything around us taking up space. Atoms are the basic building blocks of matter, and molecules are formed when two or more atoms bond together. Students completed experiments to help them understand the different ways chemicals react and that; solids, liquids and gases have observable properties. Adding or removing heat energy leads to a change of state between solids, liquids and gases. They also observed that mixtures can be formed by combining 2 or more different substances.

OUT our tool expierments!

Students learned that invisible inc was used for sending secret messages during World War 1.

In this experiment the students used juice to write messages and discovered that when the lemon juice dried it became invisible and in order for the message to be read, heat needed to be



Students created **crystals** in a jar using pipe cleaners, food colouring and borax. Crystallisation is the process of atoms or molecules arranging into a well-defined, rigid crystal lattice in order to minimize their energetic state.









Students created slime using cornstarch, dish washing liquid and food colouring. Liquid slime occurs when you bond the molecules of cornstarch and dish washing liquid together.





Students experimented with chemical reactions between chalk, vinegar and water.

They noticed that the chalk broke down much faster when in the vinegar and this caused bubbling and fizzing.











Our most fun experiment was fireworks in a jar. Students added oil and food colouring to water in a jar. They learned that colouring, like water, is denser than oil, it has more atoms packed tightly together than oil, so droplets of food colouring sink to the bottom of the oil. **BUT** when the oil and colouring are poured into the water, the oil floats to the top carrying the food colouring inside of it.



VISUAL ARTS - TERM 3











We started the term with a focus on Indigenous artists and Dreamtime stories. Preps created rainbow serpents, grade ones made sand art and grade 2s explored connection to place by painting Boonwurrung landscapes on postcards.

There has been a buzz in the art room this term as the Prep and Junior students immersed themselves in their 'Underwater World' and 'Fantastic Fish' units. They have experimented with a range of mediums and art forms such as painting, drawing, printing, sculpting and paper craft.

Students have studied closely the features of fish, jellyfish and coral.

And, they have been wowed by the effects of the UV light on their neon artworks as we prepare for a spectacular art show next term featuring a glow room to exhibit their wonderful works.
