Happy ES Day to the wonderful humans who help keep our school running so smoothly each and every day.

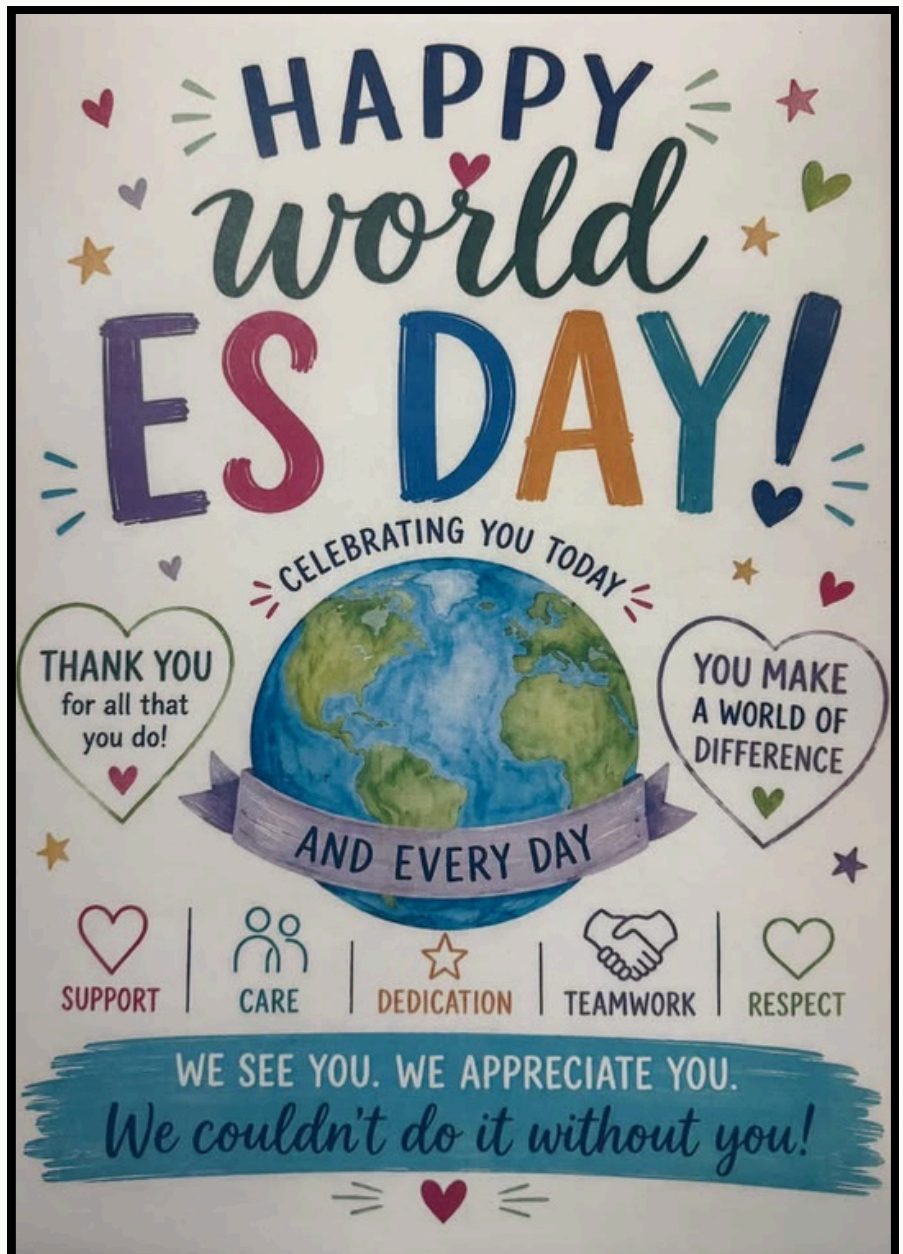
To the office staff, who answer a myriad of questions and requests with patience and care — **thank you.**

Please remember if you are picking up your child early from school, communication to the teacher via Sentral is the most effective option. National Reconciliation Week

27 to 3rd June 2026



National Reconciliation Week is held each year from 27 May to 3 June - dates that commemorate two significant milestones in Australia's reconciliation journey: the successful 1967 Referendum and the historic Mabo decision.

It is a time to reflect, listen, learn and strengthen relationships between Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and the wider community.

This year's National Reconciliation Week theme, "All In", encourages all Australians to work together toward a more connected, respectful and inclusive future. It is a reminder that reconciliation is not the responsibility of a few, it is something we can all contribute to through learning, understanding, action and meaningful conversation.

For educators, families and community settings, Reconciliation Week can provide valuable opportunities to encourage thoughtful discussions around identity, culture, Country, storytelling and connection through age-appropriate and respectful learning experiences.

Did you know?: The native hibiscus flower is the symbol of National Sorry Day. It flowers in the harshest environments across Australia, representing First Nations strength and resilience.

Industrial Action

The Australian Education Union (AEU) and the Australian Principal's Federation (APF) continue to work with the government in relation to our upcoming Enterprise Bargaining Agreement.

Following the in-principle agreement reached between the department and the Australian Education Union (AEU), the AEU informed the department on 18 May 2026 that all industrial action related to negotiations to finalise the new Victorian Government Schools Agreement (VGSA) has been entirely suspended. This includes all stop work action, including that related to school visits by Members of Parliament. The AEU had included a 'ban on all aspects of work related to the provision of written comments on student reports that will be provided to parents' in the industrial action.

We will be providing student achievement reports for Semester 1 this year as usual.

1. The reports will be distributed on Thursday 25th June via Sentral.
2. The reports will continue to provide important details about student learning attainment, but full descriptive comments will not be included as a result of industrial action taken earlier this term by the Australian Education Union.
3. We will of course be pleased to discuss with you your child's progress at our upcoming Student Led Conferences in week 9 - Book your time in via Sentral.

We very much appreciate the support of our school community as our members seek for better pay and conditions that will benefit all students and staff. Currently, Victorian students are the lowest funded in the country and Victorian teachers, the lowest paid.

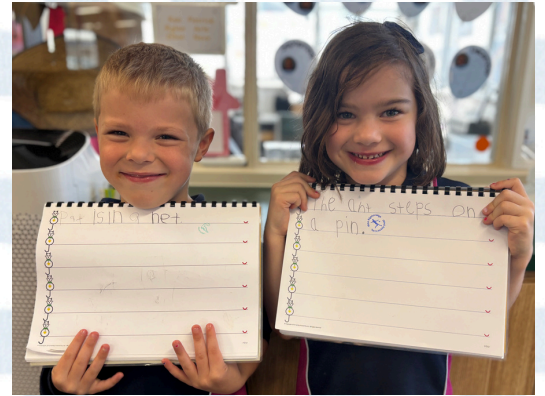

Veggie Garden Glow Up at Kingsley Park Primary School

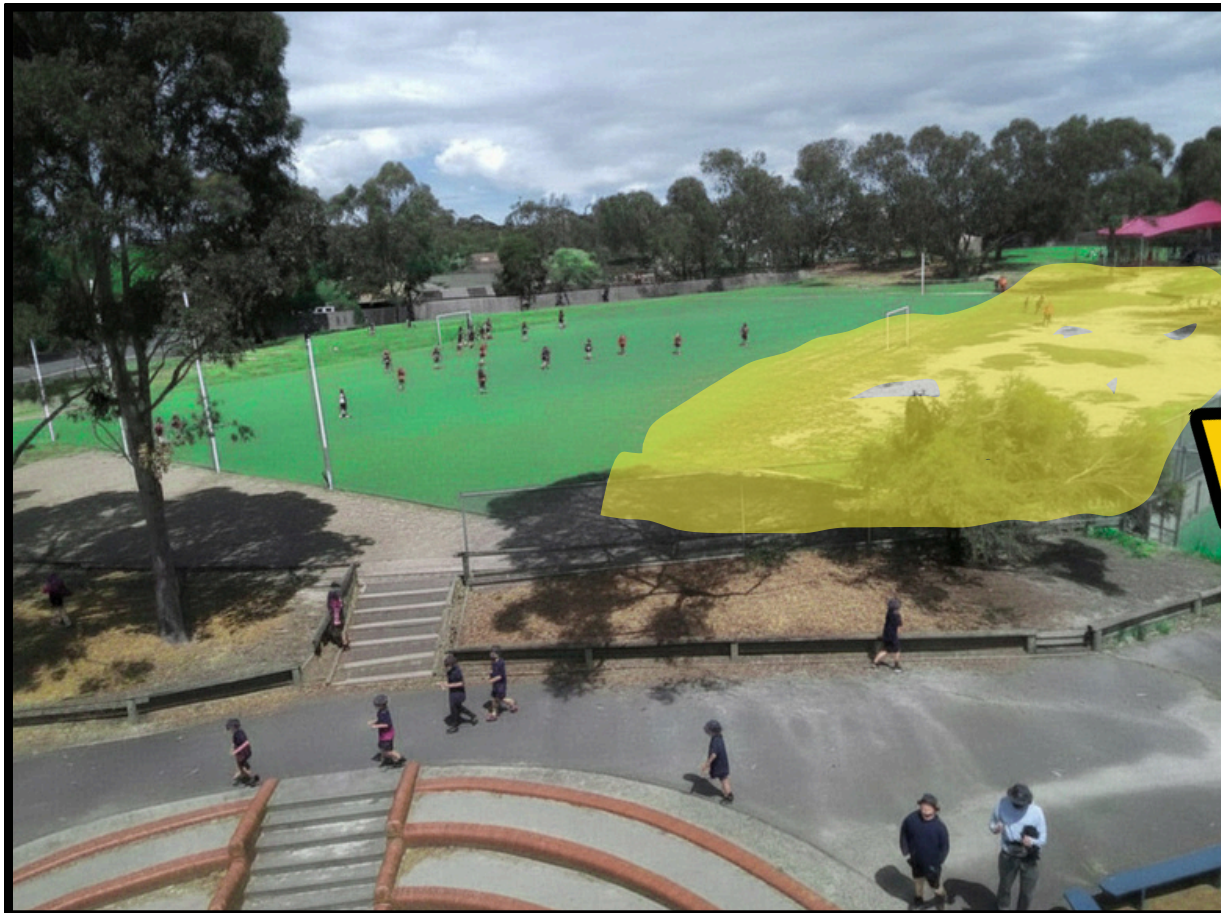


Kingsley Park Primary School's veggie garden is getting a fresh new look and it's an exciting step in their whole-school approach to learning about and promoting nutritious and delicious food. Led by Abe Kenny, PE Leader at the school, the garden glow up is being supported by enthusiastic students, Bayside Health Peninsula, and the generous team at Bunnings Frankston. "I am proud of the work I have done in our school garden. My favourite plant in our garden is basil, it's just delicious!" said Harper, grade 5 student at Kingsley Park Primary.

The refreshed garden features themed beds including a soup garden, a salad garden, and an Indigenous garden bed filled with bush foods such as warrigal greens, lemon myrtle and bush tomatoes. These spaces will help students make meaningful connections between growing food, culture and wellbeing.

More than just a garden, this space is a living classroom, bringing together curriculum learning, wellbeing, and community in one vibrant, growing hub.

Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships

Kingsley Park Primary School is a proud Respectful Relationships school.

Respectful relationships education is part of the Victorian Curriculum and delivered by all Victorian government schools. It supports students to develop the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed for respectful relationships, and helps to build respect and equality across the entire school community. Research tells us that providing respectful relationships education at school can lead to positive impacts on students' academic outcomes, their mental health, classroom behaviour and relationships.

Our school uses the Department of Education's evidence-based teaching and learning resources to teach our students about **Respectful Relationships from Foundation to Grade 6**. The Resilience, Rights and Respectful Relationships resources have 8 topics that teach students about emotional literacy, personal and cultural strengths, resilience, problem-solving, stress-management, help-seeking, gender norms and stereotypes and positive gender relations.

This term our **Foundation students are working on Topic 3: Positive Coping** which supports students to develop language around coping, reflect on their coping strategies and build a range of positive coping strategies.

The rest of our students **years 1 - 6 are working on Topic 6: Help-seeking** which helps students to develop skills and knowledge for peer support, peer referral and help-seeking. You can view a sample activity from this topic below.

Foundation: The Fast Emotions Game - Students will play a game to show their understanding of words for emotions.

Year 1/2: The Life Raft Game for a focus on help-seeking - Students play a game that involves them helping other players. Students will use the game to talk about how friends can help each other.

Year 3/4: How big is the problem? - Students will use made up scenarios to identify which problems are serious enough to mean that it is important to seek help from an adult. Students will also work on being able to describe why it is important to seek help from an adult for serious problems.

Year 5/6: I wonder if I need help with this? - Students will identify types of problems that they can solve independently. Students will identify how they may benefit from seeking help from peers for particular types of problems. Students will identify how they may benefit from seeking help from adults or services for particular types of problems.

SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S WELLBEING: WHY IT MATTERS & WHAT YOU CAN DO

At Kingsley Park Primary School, we are committed to supporting the wellbeing of every student. When children feel safe, supported and connected, they are better able to learn, build friendships and navigate challenges. Research consistently shows that wellbeing and learning are closely linked. Children who are emotionally secure are more engaged, resilient and confident learners.

A helpful resource for families is "[Five Ways to Support Your Child's Wellbeing](#)" by Emerging Minds. This guide outlines practical, everyday ways parents can nurture their child's mental health and emotional development. We encourage you to explore the full document using the link provided, but here is a summary of the key ideas.

WHY WELLBEING MATTERS

Children's wellbeing is shaped by their experiences, relationships and environment. Positive mental health does not mean children are always happy. It means they have the skills and support to manage emotions, cope with challenges and feel a sense of belonging. Strong wellbeing in childhood lays the foundation for lifelong learning, relationships and resilience.

FIVE KEY WAYS TO SUPPORT YOUR CHILD'S WELLBEING

The resource introduces five important areas of family life that help promote and protect children's wellbeing:

1. PARENT CHILD RELATIONSHIPS

Strong, positive relationships are the foundation of wellbeing. Spending time together, listening and responding warmly helps children feel safe, valued and understood.

2. EMOTIONS AND BEHAVIOURS

Children need support to understand and express their feelings. Being curious about their emotions, and helping them name and manage them, builds emotional skills and confidence.

3. ROUTINES

Predictable routines help children feel secure and reduce stress. Simple structures around meals, sleep and family time provide stability and a sense of control.

4. COMMUNICATION AND MEANING MAKING

Open, honest conversations help children make sense of their world, especially during challenging times. Taking time to listen and talk strengthens trust and understanding.

5. SUPPORT NETWORKS

No family does it alone. Connecting with friends, extended family, school staff and community services helps children and parents feel supported and less isolated.

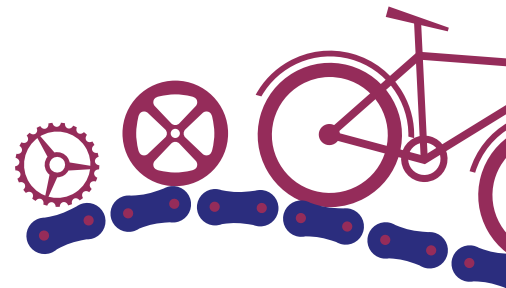
A GENTLE REMINDER FOR FAMILIES

It is important to remember that supporting wellbeing does not require perfection. Small, conversation can make a big difference over time. These little moments are the building blocks of positive mental health.

Books and brain development: why reading is important.

Our Kingsley Kids are all expected to read every night for at least 15-20 minutes.



Reading is essential because it actively stimulates the brain, expanding your vocabulary, knowledge, and critical thinking skills. Beyond intellectual growth, it builds empathy by allowing you to experience different perspectives, and it serves as a proven way to reduce stress and improve mental well-being.

The benefits of building a regular reading habit stretch across all areas of life, offering both immediate and long-term improvements:

- **Brain Health & Cognitive Function:** Reading acts as a mental workout. It strengthens neural pathways, improves concentration, and may even help delay cognitive decline as we age.
- **Empathy & Perspective:** By immersing yourself in different characters' experiences, you naturally develop a greater capacity to understand and relate to the emotions and backgrounds of others.
- **Vocabulary & Communication:** Regular exposure to words on a page effortlessly builds your vocabulary, which in turn enhances your own writing and verbal communication skills.
- **Stress Reduction:** Escaping into a compelling narrative or learning something new forces the mind to unplug from daily anxieties, which lowers heart rate and eases tension.

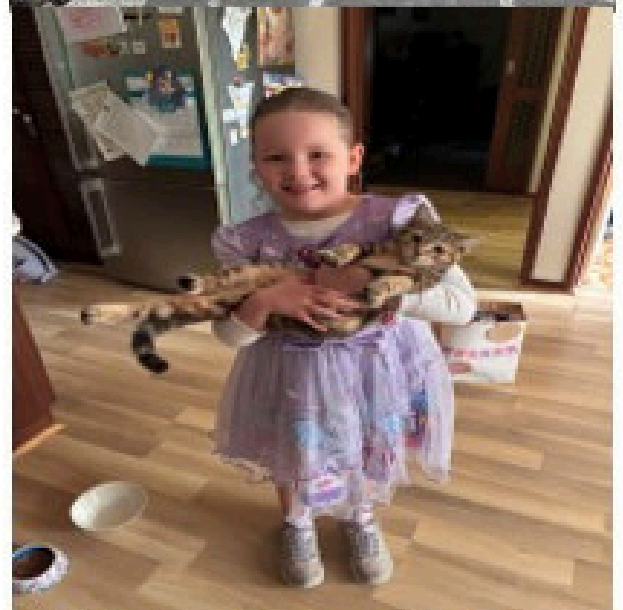
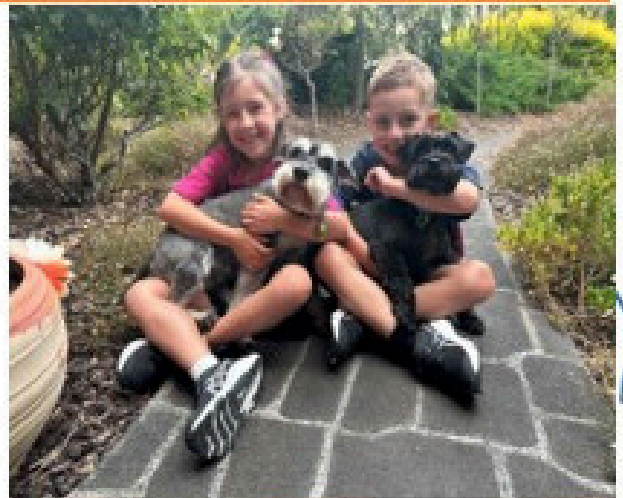

Winter is Coming so is Flu Season!

As we enter the colder months of the year, it is important to remind families there are many things we can still do to prevent the transmission of illness be it COVID or flu-like colds and coughs:

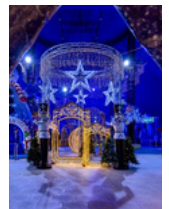
A magical winter journey at FROSTED - A Winter Spectacular, celebrating Christmas in July is coming to Melbourne!

Protecting Against Measles

Measles cases are rising in Victoria and around the world.

Returned travellers make up most cases, but local spread has also been detected. Vaccination is the most safe and effective way to protect yourself and others against measles. People need 2 doses of a measles-containing vaccine to be fully protected.

To help protect against measles, you should check your family's measles vaccinations today.

This is particularly important if you are:

- planning any travel
- were born during or after 1966
- were born overseas.

You can check your measles vaccination records:

- on your Medicare online account through [MyGov](#) or by contacting the [Australian Immunisation Register](#) on 1800 653 809
- on your personal health records, such as your childhood immunisation records
- by speaking to your GP or immunisation provider.



About measles

Measles is a viral infection. It spreads easily from airborne droplets, such as from coughing or sneezing, and nose and throat secretions.

Symptoms may include:

- fever
- feeling tired or unwell
- cough or runny nose
- sore and red eyes (conjunctivitis)
- diarrhoea – especially in infants.

This is usually followed by a red, blotchy, non-itchy rash that often starts on the face before spreading down the body. Measles can cause serious illness and be life-threatening. People who are not fully immunised or have not had a previous measles infection are at increased risk. Pregnant women, children aged under 5 years and those with weakened immune systems are at increased risk of severe illness and complications.

If your child develops measles symptoms, you should:

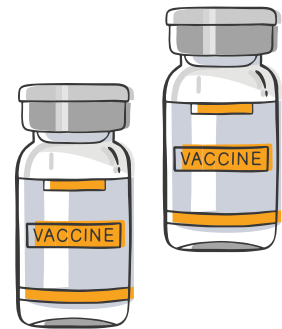
- keep your child home from school and seek medical care and testing
- call the health service and wear a face mask when travelling to and attending the health service
- let our school know if your child has measles, or is being tested for measles
- keep your child at home until well and advised by a health professional.

Free measles vaccines

Anyone who does not have 2 doses of measles vaccine, or is unsure, can get a measles vaccine.

Free vaccines are available for:

infants aged 12 months to 18 months, children and teenagers aged under 20 years, adult refugees and humanitarian entrants.



Vaccination is widely available at your GP, local pharmacist, local council or Aboriginal Health Service. Call ahead to see if you are eligible for a free vaccine.

The Orange Door

The Orange Door can help families. They provide support for concerns with parenting, relationships, and family violence.

The Orange Door is a free intake and assessment service for:

- *families requiring support for their child or young person's wellbeing or development*
- *families needing parenting support*
- *young, isolated, or unsupported families*
- *individuals and families experiencing family violence*
- *adults using family violence*
- *young people using violence in the home.*
- *If you contact The Orange Door, they can help by:*
- *working with you to identify the help and support you need*
- *supporting you with the wellbeing and development of your child or young person*
- *helping you make a safety plan if someone is making you feel unsafe*
- *connecting you to services that can help like counselling, accommodation, mental health and drug and alcohol services, parenting support groups, services for children, financial help, or legal assistance*
- *supporting you to access funding for basic living expenses and some other costs*
- *supporting you to change abusive or controlling behaviour.*

Each Orange Door location across Victoria has their own phone number and email. Students and their families can also visit their local Orange Door in person for support, Monday to Friday, 9am - 5pm for support. No appointment is needed. How schools connect with The Orange Door

Our school might talk to a student and/or their family about The Orange Door. We might encourage them to contact their local Orange Door to get advice and help if needed. Ideally, a student and/or their family will get in touch with The Orange Door to seek advice and support. Sometimes, schools might make a referral to The Orange Door without the student or their family's knowledge or consent. Schools will do this if:

- *informing a student and/or family increases the risk to their safety or wellbeing*
- *not linking a student to support increases the risk of their safety and wellbeing.*
