

Parking and Driving Around Our School

Recently a few parents have approached me about the school crossings and driver safety. We shared our concerns about driver behaviours, congestions and parking. We are a very lucky community with both Franciscan Avenue and Gattinara Drive available for parking before and after school.

It is important to remember that the parking directly outside of the school's main entry is for 2 minutes only between 8:30am and 9:00am on school mornings and from 3.00-3.25 to assist with easy, safe and

quick drop offs.

Also, the Staff Car Park is for Staff only.



Please ensure that you travel at the 40kmph Speed Limit or lower around our school. It is important that we model to our children Road Safety, by using the pedestrian crossings to cross the road and always follow the School Crossing Supervisors' directions. Please be advised that the pedestrian crossing on Gattinara Drive has been very hard to staff recently. Our regular supervisor, Russell is very unwell and may not be returning to us. We wish Russell all the very best and thank him sincerely for his many years with us and his friendly nature assisting us to cross roads safely. Traffic Management cameras have been out and about recently to determine any issues of concern and will continue to be seen for a few weeks.



NO U-TURNS: Please use the roundabouts at each end of Franciscan Avenue to safely turn around, rather than doing a U-turn in front of the school, particularly given there are a lot of young children around. The council have now officially issued the area at the front of Franciscan Avenue with no U turn signs so please but aware of this change.

Student Attendance

The Department of Education outlines clear expectations for student attendance, which includes being present for the full day. This means from the start of the morning bell at 8.45am to the end of the day at 3.15pm.

Regular attendance is essential for every child's academic success and social development.

90% of our students and families are amazing with their attendance and punctuality, only taking necessary days of absence when unwell and ensuring they are in class ready for learning time to begin-well done to you all, keep up the great work. The average number of days absent to date is 5! Many of our families are also amazing at informing the school of absences with valid reasons. Thank you for this, explanations are not only very important, they are also a legal requirement.



Notifying the School of Absences:

It is the responsibility of parents and carers to notify the school if your child will be absent. If we have not received notification by 9:30 am, an automated SMS will be sent to you.

Staff absences

Just as children get sick, so do teachers. At present, it can be very difficult for us to get casual replacement staff for our classes some days. Unfortunately this means we have to split classes rather than be able to put a teacher in front of the whole class. Whilst not ideal, this is our only solution. Students are relocated to the same year level or one closest to their current year level. We ask you to please discuss this with your child and remind them that our expectations are the same across all classrooms regardless of where they are; Be Respectful, be Safe and be a Learner so that their learning can continue in the best way possible and they do not disrupt and distract the learning time of others.

Our Kingsley Kids have adapted very well to this when it has happened and have continued to demonstrate their beautiful manners and learning application. We do our best to replace the classroom teacher when we

We understand that mornings can be challenging, for some families more than others - juggling work, family and daily routines is no easy task. At times, children may say they don't want to come to school for various reasons and it can be tempting to give them the day off.
