


The Principal, the student, their parents/carers have a conference to discuss the most serious behaviours

Sovereign Hill Camp ———



Senior School students started Term 3 with a trip back in time to Sovereign Hill in Ballarat. The weather gods were on our side, as students explored what life was like in colonial Australia during the Gold Rush in 1851. Students participated in 'Gold Fever' which allowed for role play experiences of miners, gold buyers and troopers to understand the events leading up to the Eureka Rebellion in 1854. Through the 'Eureka Story' educational program students re-created scenes in full costume to learn about the significance of this event on the developing colony in Victoria. Students also explored over 15 hectares visiting many different businesses, panning for gold, two gold mine tours, demonstrations of candle dipping, lolly making, musket firing, gold pouring and having fun with their friends through trivia, movie nights and chatting over meals.

ONE STEP AT A TIME PROGRAM: PARENTSUPPORT FOR CHILDHOOD ANXIETY

Swinburne Psychology Clinic

Parents / quardians:

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- · Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals
- Excessive worry and constant reassurance seeking
- Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- Two combined parent-child sessions
- · Reflective parenting strategies
- Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.

Cost

\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.




