On Monday, we witnessed a very near miss as a parent went to perform a u-turn out the front of the school. PLEASE value the safety of our students and use the roundabouts located not far away. It takes 10 seconds to reach the round-about but only 1 second for a car to impact a child with possible severe consequences. This continues to occur too often despite many reminders.

There are very clear 'no u-turn' signs, please abide by them. We have again asked the Police and Council to monitor the school crossing and parking areas. We also remind parents that they cannot leave cars parked in the 'Kiss and Go' zone directly at the front of the school. This space is for cars to be able to enter and exit for swift and careful drop-offs. Again, over the past week we have had cars double park and call students out to them risking the safety of their own students. Cars must be in a clearly marked space before allowing students to enter or leave the car.

Prioritising our children's safety is an URGENT MATTER. Please abide by the road rules for the safety of all.

If you have concerns about the traffic safety in our school zone, please contact Frankston Council to assist us with helping to monitor our area.

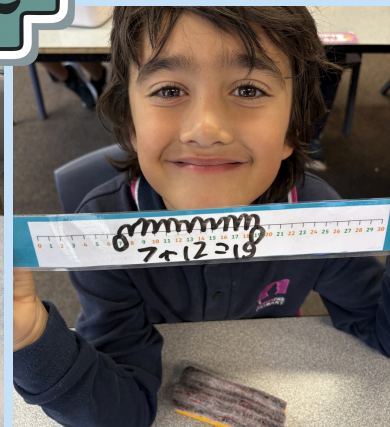
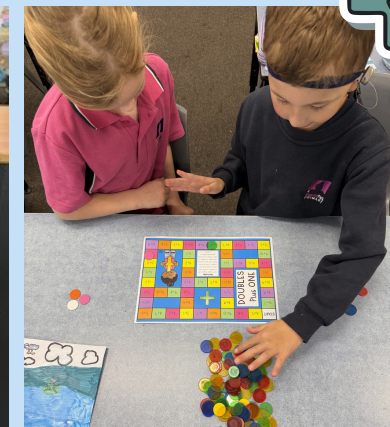
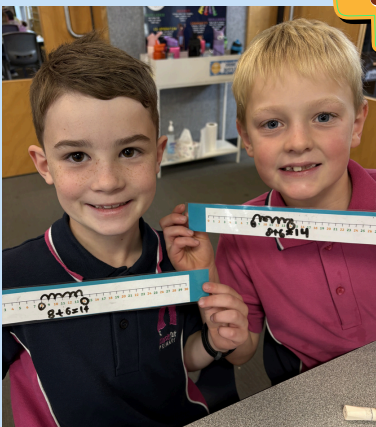
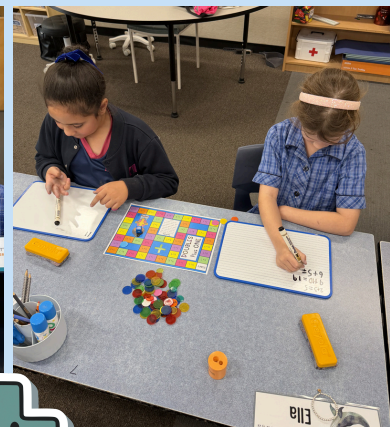
This term, Year 1 students have been practising their addition skills. We have used different strategies like counting on and 'Think Big, Count Small' to add numbers. We used concrete materials like counters and unifix to help us. Students have been exposed to Friends of Ten and have been practising this concept in many different ways. "Friends of 10" (or number bonds to 10) are pairs of numbers that add up to 10. These essential math pairs—(0+10, 1+9, 2+8, 3+7, 4+6, 5+5) (and their reverses)—help children build foundational mental math skills for addition and subtraction.





Over the past few weeks, our Year 2 students have been busy exploring a range of effective strategies to solve addition problems. From jumping along number lines and using 100s charts, to finding doubles and near doubles, and building number facts to 10 and 20- it's been wonderful to see their confidence grow!

Learning has been hands-on and full of energy, with students using materials, getting creative through craft, and enjoying plenty of games along the way. It's been a joyful few weeks of maths in action!

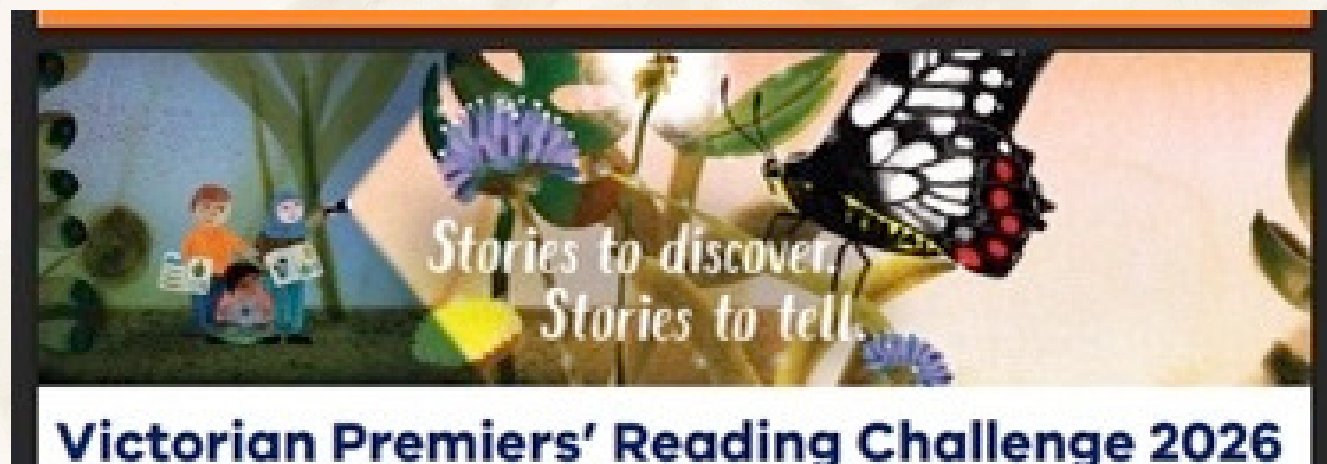
Did you know?

Reading for pleasure offers profound health benefits, including reducing stress by up to 68% in just six minutes and potentially increasing lifespan by two years with 30 minutes of daily reading. It improves cognitive function, empathy, and vocabulary, while 30 minutes of weekly reading boosts life satisfaction.

Stress Reduction: Reading is more effective at reducing stress than walking or listening to music, lowering stress levels by 68% in six minutes.

Sleep Improvement: Reading before bed helps people wind down, improving sleep quality.

Academic Achievement: The number of books in a home is strongly linked to higher academic achievement in children.

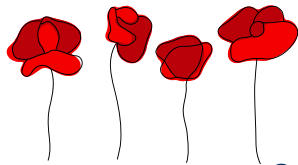

But you can change what they learn in that moment.

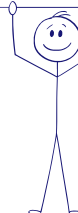
Let's all work towards building a growth mindset to help all our children.

Stay well this winter

Influenza (flu) can be serious, especially for children. Choose to protect yourself and your loved ones with an **annual flu vaccine**. The earlier you and your family get vaccinated, the better your protection heading into winter. Keeping our school community well We encourage parents and carers and students to:

- wash or sanitise your hands thoroughly and regularly, particularly before and after touching your face
- cough or sneeze into your elbow
- stay home if unwell and consult your GP or **Nurse-on-Call** as needed
- stay up to date with your flu vaccinations.

Flu vaccination is recommended for everyone aged 6 months and older. Some people are more at risk of severe illness from flu, especially babies and toddlers. They can get a **free vaccination** as part of the National Immunisation Program. You can book a flu vaccine through your GP or pharmacy, or **find a flu vaccine near you**.

RSV vaccinations for mothers and babies: **RSV (respiratory syncytial virus)** is a common virus that causes colds and ear infections. In babies, it can cause severe illness like **bronchiolitis**.

The RSV vaccine is available for pregnant women as part of the National Immunisation Program. In Victoria, eligible babies can also get the RSV vaccine until Wednesday 30 September 2026. You can speak with your GP or midwife about the vaccine.

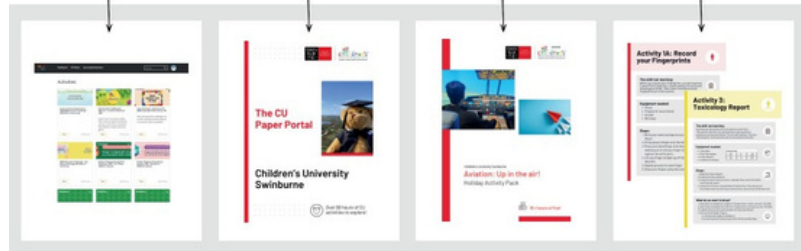

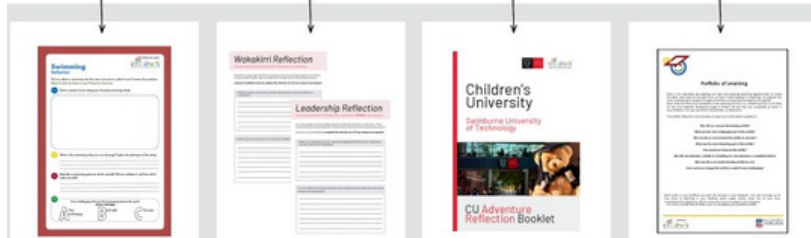

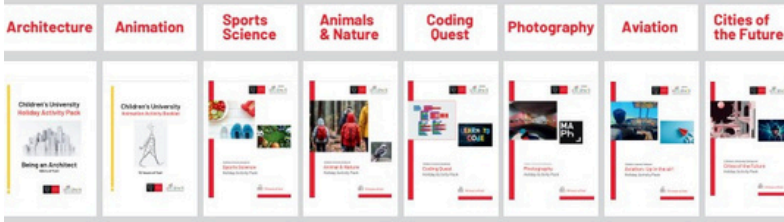
