An indication of how your child is progressing will be clearly seen on the graph in the report indicating their progress. It is however equally important to look at growth in the context of the Effort your child has demonstrated in their learning areas.

In readiness for Semester 1 reports being available in the last week, next week Student Led Conferences are being held. We strongly encourage all parents, (except for those who have had SSGs already) to attend a meeting with their child. Not only do teachers spend time assessing, evaluating and writing reports, but students also take time to reflect on their learning achievements and goals as they prepare to take a leading role during the Conference.

It is our belief that through active involvement, students take greater ownership and responsibility for their learning efforts. Further to this, the Conferences acknowledge that learning is the shared responsibility of students, parents and teachers.

We hope your child enjoys their time reflecting on their semester, sharing their progress with you and feels positive about their achievements.

Please note that Specialist staff will be available in the library on Wednesday

evening to allow parents to have a chat with them in the areas of PE, Visual or Performing Arts and Auslan with the staff.

Allocate your School Saving Bonus NOW



Families can continue to use School Saving Bonus (SSB) funds until Monday, 30 June 2025 to buy uniforms or to allocate funds to school activities using the parent/carer online system.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a school activities credit held against the family account for each student. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until early August. This means you will need to pay for school activities during July/early August if you don't allocate your SSB funds.

To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the <u>SSB online system</u> and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.



Bringing the Novel to Life Through Tableau




<u> Literary Symbolism – using symbols to represent ideas</u>

JUNIORS:

This term, Junior students have been focusing on dance elements such as shape, space and pathways. Department of Education Policy Updates

Racism

The Department of Education announced a new stand-alone racism policy on 3 June. This new policy is designed to help schools take actions to prevent and address racism, religious intolerance and racial and religious vilification.

In our recent Student Attitudes to School survey data, it was pleasing to see that many students felt this was not an problem here at Kingsley Park and more so that if they experienced racism, they knew who to report it to and felt safe it would be dealt with.

All Victorian government schools must implement this policy from the start of Term 3, 2025. In line with Child Safe Standard 1 and Child Safe Standard 5, all Victorian government schools must actively prevent and respond to racism and report incidents to the department.

The policy covers 3 key actions:

- Preventing racism: schools must maintain culturally safe and inclusive environments.
- Responding to racism: schools must have clear, timely, safe and inclusive processes to respond to incidents of racism.
- Reporting racism: schools must report incidents of racism on eduSafe Plus, as per the Managing and Reporting School Incidents (Including Emergencies) policy.

Suspension and expulsion

You may be aware of recent changes announced in the media to suspension and expulsion powers that will be available to Victorian principals from day one of Term 3, (Monday 21 July 2025). We know that students' behaviour outside of school, particularly online, can sometimes impact the safety of students and staff at school.

In exceptional circumstances, principals of Victorian government schools will be able suspend or expel students for behaviour that occurs outside of school grounds and/or hours including online, if it poses a significant danger to the safety and wellbeing of students or staff. These powers apply only to serious incidents where there is a clear and close connection to the school and the behaviour of a student outside of school unreasonably impacts the safety and wellbeing of students or staff at school, and their ability to learn or work. Please note: They do not apply to behaviours unrelated to the school or school community. They only apply to behaviour which occurs from Monday 21 July 2025 onwards.

Suspension and expulsion will remain measures of last resort – our Kingsley way continues to focus on proactive and positive behaviour support, including working with you to teach students the behaviours we expect of them, in school and in life. We strongly focus on our 3 key expectations; Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be a Learner and are working our way through Minor and Major behaviours and what the consequences look like. We hope you have been keeping up to date with our evolving processes and procedures over the term. We are here to work with families to get the best for all of our students here at Kingsley Park. Don't forget feedback is warmly welcomed and encouraged via email to the school.

ONE STEP AT A TIME PROGRAM: PARENTSUPPORT FOR CHILDHOOD ANXIETY



Parents / guardians:

Do you have a primary school-aged child experiencing symptoms of anxiety?

Clinicians at Swinburne University have developed a program to help parents manage childhood anxiety in children aged 6-11 years.

Does your child experience any of the following?

- · Difficulties sleeping at night due to worries
- · Fears and phobias
- · Difficulty separating from you or worrying about parental safety
- · Trouble sleeping alone in their bed
- · Fear of the dark
- · Scared of lifts, trains, and people
- · Fear of dogs and other animals Excessive worry and constant
- reassurance seeking · Fear of germs and other health problems

The One Step at a Time Program involves:

- Comprehensive psychological assessment of your child's anxiety
- Seven sessions of online counselling through video conferencing
- Parent-focused cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT) skills to help you manage and support your child's anxiety
- · Two combined parent-child sessions
- · Reflective parenting strategies
- · Access to a website with selfhelp materials to supplement therapy.



\$20 per session/assessment. Treatment consists of seven therapy sessions plus one assessment session.

Kingsley Park PS is working towards a school wide positive behaviour framework that involves the establishment of a Continuum of Behaviour Support that considers all students and emphasises prevention.

Kingsley Park has devised, after receiving parent feedback, an understanding of Major and Minor behaviours and behaviour steps that are used to manage them and the outcomes.

Whilst we acknowledge that all situations are different and some students may have a diagnosis and do not have intent behind their behaviours, it is expected that parents and the school work together to understand and reduce these behaviours and the impact they have on others.

We recognise that all students can learn expectations and behaviours, some may take longer to learn them but most thrive with boundaries and routines.

A school information book is currently underway to provide parens with a clear picture of what this looks like. Thank you to those who have sent in valuable thoughts and feedback.
