
A NEW 2025 INITIATIVE FOR KINGSLEY PARK

Have you tried the breakfast gratitude game?



What is the objective of the breakfast gratitude game is:

A positive and reflective way to start the day, this game involves sharing gratitude and intentions over breakfast. Participants roll a dice to determine which gratitudethemed question they will answer, encouraging a positive mindset and fostering connections with others.

KPPS EXPECTATIONS AND BEHAVIOUR RESPONSES





These are the 3 key expectations that we expect all students to follow at all times. Whilst we still have our core school Values of; Excellence, Respect, Resilience, Cooperation and Community these are all encompassed in our 3 key expectations.

Our key focus is on recognising the positive behaviours that we see across the school however, when we see behaviours that go against our expectations, we follow a 5 step process.

Steps that are followed that include;

Remind - a quick positive reminder of the behaviours we like to see; RESTATE- restate the behaviours expected if they continue to occur; RELOCATE - this may include relocating to a different space within the room while a child thinks about their behaviours, even moving tables to cease the chatter between friends; REMOVE - means the child may need to be moved from the room to regulate, sometimes this is to another room to complete their work or to the office if the behaviours warrant further discussion; REPAIR - this is a restorative conversation between affected parties to repair the relationship and continue the focus on mutual respect.

It is important for parents to be in alignment with our school expectations to help us endorse and promote our values to ensure a positive learning climate for all.




VISUAL ARTS UPDATE

I am pleased to report that the Middles and Seniors are in the depths of creating some amazing artworks!

The Middles have looked at the works of Pablo Picasso and Sandra Silberzweig to identify colours and shapes and explore cubism and abstract portraits. They have learnt about analogous colours and are applying this knowledge to their own artworks. Grade 3s are experimenting with new techniques and materials and adding soft pastels to their work this week. Grade 4s brought their cardboard portraits to life with analogous paint last week and are playing with posca patterns this week. Senior students are deep in the 'learning pit' and using a growth mindset to draw their self-portrait. With resilience, persistence, and courage, we are seeing some beautiful likenesses and students realising they in fact 'CAN DO IT'. I can't wait to share the finished results with you soon.

JUNIORS

This term, the Junior students have been learning about rhythm and pitch and keeping the beat. We have been exploring music notation using icy pole sticks to show long and short notes and demonstrating high and low pitch with our voices and percussion instruments.





Last week we used our knowledge of rhythm to create a 2 bar body percussion piece. The Year One students used action cards of stomp, pat, clap and click to demonstrate long and short notes and some Year Two students even gave it a go to draw their own percussion cues.


